Recognition and Awards Speech



IMMANUEL/EMMANUEL - GOD WITH US

From the beginning of creation there is evidence of God's presence everywhere. The heavens declare His glory and the firmament shows His handiwork. Mankind is now discovering what God spoke about to Job eons ago. God has been operating throughout the whole earth. It is He who created the earth and everything in it. He was with Adam an Eve in the garden of Eden. He is God, and will always be God. Even when Adam sinned, God promised that He would correct the separation that sin had caused. In Genesis we see the promise that God made to Abraham

in **Genesis 28:15** "I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land. I will not leave you until I have done what I have spoken to you."

Whatever God determines will come to pass. So, the children of Israel (Abraham seed) ended up in Egypt as God had indicated previously. They became slaves there until God sent Moses to deliver them and to take them to the Promised Land. The children of Israel were a tough bunch who attracted God's wrath on several occasions. In a dialogue with God, Moses indicated that unless God was going with them, he didn't want to leave where they were. In **Exodus 33:14** The Lord replied, "My presence will go with you and I will give you rest".

The children of Israel were not a contended people. They murmured, and complained about the provision of God every chance they got; and yet God did not renege on His promise to be with them. He made them overcome great challenges, so much so that other nations heard about it, and were afraid of the Israelites.

Leviticus 26:11-12 – "I will put my dwelling place among you and I will not abhor you. I will walk among you and be your God and you will be my people".

2 Chronicles13:12 - "God is with us. He is our leader. His priests with their trumpets will sound the battle cry against you. People of Israel do not fight against the LORD the God of your ancestors, for you will not succeed".

The sons of Korah acknowledged the presence of God as we often read in the very popular **Psalm 46:7** "The Lord Almighty is with you; the God of Jacob is our fortress".

God has been with us all the time, so what's the difference between the Old Testament declarations and the New? Mankind kept sinning and crying out for help. In the Old Testament, animals had to be slaughtered and the blood offered as an atonement for sins once a year. God's plan of salvation means that there is hope for the whole world, through the blood of Jesus Christ – His only begotten son. John the Baptist identified Him as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Jesus came and died so we can have everlasting life.

Isaiah chapter 14 is very interesting. Everyone should read it. The prophet Isaiah described what had been taking place in the land at the time and declared that there would come One who would save and redeem

mankind. **Verse 7** says "Therefore the LORD Himself will give you a sign: the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call Him Immanuel. Isaiah's prophesy was fulfilled in the New Testament several hundred years later.

It is recorded in **Matthew 1:22-23** "All this took place to fulfill what the Lord has said through the prophet: "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a Son, and they will call Him Immanuel (which means God with us". In the book of John, we read that "The Word (who was in the beginning with God) became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth".

Why is that a big deal? Because when Jesus Christ came in the flesh, He lived like us on earth. He is therefore able to identify with challenges that we all face from time to time. He sits at the right hand of the throne of God making intercessions for us. The best part of all, is that is He is able to help us in and through **all** our struggles. There is nothing that we've faced in life, that He cannot identify with. He knew what it was like to have people not understand Him, and not recognize Him for who He was; He knew what it was like to have his friends deny him, betray Him, not being there for Him, and feeling forsaken by his Father. He paid the full price of our redemption and salvation through His death and resurrection, and gives us hope for eternal life. That's a big deal! We have a lot to sing about and celebrate this and every Christmas, and everyday for that matter. God is with us and will never leave us. Isn't that great news? Let's tell someone about it. This great God who is with us will never leave us. That's what Christmas is about! Emmanuel! Let's make it personal this Christmas; tell someone about the greatest gift of all. Merry Christmas.
