

# **Sophia Young**

Professional WNBA basketball player with the San Antonio Silver Stars

Sophia is one of only two Vincentian women ever to play in the WNBA. She also recently played for the European championship club Galatasaray of Turkey. In 2005 Sophia helped the Baylor University Lady Bears win their first NCAA National Championship. She is one of only four women in NCAA history to score 2,000 points, grab 1,000 rebounds, collect 300 steals, as well as dish out 300 assists. Off the court Sophia's passion is to help children and teens that have been abused and/ or neglected in one form or another. She has adopted a charity named Roy Maas Alternative Inc. This is a charity that is committed to helping kids to have a better life. While at Baylor she began sponsoring a pre-teen boy in Rwanda. She continues that sponsorship today – writing the boy letters and sending him regular financial gifts. After she retires, Sophia wants to open a shelter for abused girls.

## The Right Honourable Dr. Alvin Curling

As the member of Provincial Parliament for the Ontario riding of Scarborough-Rouge River, Jamaican-born Curling has won five consecutive elections, making him one of the most long-standing members of the Legislature of Ontario. He has spent his time in office as a strong advocate for minority voices by upholding the principles of inclusiveness, public service, and human rights in his dedication to the "preservation of democracy".

First elected to Ontario Legislature general election 1985; re-elected general election 1987, 1990, 1995, 1999; minister of housing, 1985-87; minister of skills development, 1987-89; parliamentary assistant to the minister of intergovernmental affairs until 1990; former deputy whip for the official opposition; appointed: official opposition critic for housing, 1995; official opposition critic for urban affairs and official opposition critic for youth, 1999; official opposition critic for training and skills development and Speaker of the Legislature.

Curling resigned his seat in the Legislative Assembly on August 19, 2005 to accept a diplomatic posting as Canada's ambassador to the Dominican Republic. He was recalled from this position in 2006.

Curling is now a Senior Fellow at CIGI (International Economic Governance) in Waterloo Ontario and Co-Chair of the Premier's Task Force on the Review of the Roots of Youth Violence. In the mid-2000s, Curling was honoured by the government of Jamaica with a Rank of Distinction. He holds the title of Commander.


